

Application Process

Fill out the "Nustadia Recreation Sports Field Request Form" and submit no later than March 1. Requests received after the deadline date will only be considered after all the requests received on time have been accommodated.

Nustadia Recreation and the Dept. of Recreation, Parks, Tourism & Culture will review the total hours requested for each category of field. If sufficient time exists, all requests will be accommodated. If any category receives more requests than the available field time, a schedule will be established based on the following criteria:

- Youth groups before adult.
- Moncton groups before non-residents (To qualify as a "Moncton group" teams or leagues must have a minimum of 65% of participants who are residents of the City of Moncton). Priority Codes will be followed (see list).
- Established groups or leagues will receive preference over new(er) groups
- Only those adult groups who can provide payment in full or post-dated cheques for the entire season, in advance, will be considered.

Field Distribution Guidelines:

Whenever possible, field times will be distributed in the following manner:

- Competitive teams will be allocated a minimum of 2 regulation game times per week.
- Organized recreational teams will be allocated a minimum of 2 regulation game times per week.
- Provincial level minor teams will be allocated 90 minutes of development time per week.
- Tournaments or other special events and activities will be allocated times based on availability and overall seasonal schedules.
- School boards, colleges and universities will be allocated time to comply with existing reciprocal use agreements between the City of Moncton and their organization.
- All other users will be allocated field time based on remaining availability following the above guidelines.

Priority Schedule:

Priority A

Programs operated or sponsored by the City of Moncton.

Priority B

Minor organizations such as (Minor Baseball, Minor Football, Minor Soccer, Minor Softball), Schools, colleges and universities under a reciprocal use agreement.

Priority C

Competitive adult programs (Groups utilizing a constitution, formulated league rules which do not alter the basic game dimensions, current certified umpires and referees, tryouts, and playing to advance to a provincial championship.

Priority D

Organized adult recreation.

Priority E

Schools, colleges and universities not under a reciprocal use agreement.

Priority F

Tournaments, special events and activities (Tournaments include invitational events that are not part of an organized league. For leagues in priority B, C, D or E, one fundraising event can be booked per season under the appropriate Priority, all other tournaments will be categorized as Priority F).

Priority G

Casual users.

Priority H

Practice or development requests except where the user group qualifies under Priority A to G.

Priority I

Non-resident user groups or teams.
